Parking of trailers & vehicles: All vehicles including trailers, horse boxes and cars etc. should be parked outside the property in the designated parking area. Permission to park within the show grounds should be made in writing to the Show Manager (subject to availability).

*Order of Classes: Please note that this list does not necessarily represent the order of classes.

Rules: The CEA RJC will be run in accordance with the 2017 CEA RJC rules which can be found on the CIEF website (ciefcay.com) under Events > Prize Lists for Upcoming Shows or by choosing Tests, Forms & Rules > Rules.

For the RJC, each rider will ride two rounds. The winner of the class will be the rider with the least number of faults over the two rounds. Ties will be broken using the fastest time taken in the second round.

The 0.6m Open and 0.5m Open classes will be run FEI Table A at a speed of 300mpm. Any ties in the number of faults will be broken using Optimal Time.

Awards/Rosettes: Mounted awards will be presented after each height. Rosettes will be awarded to 8th place in all classes.

SHOW ENTRY

All competitors must be members of the CIEF for the current show season. Please complete a show entry form and an RJC Declaration form (if applicable) and drop it, along with payment into the CIEF folder at the EC or give to Tracey Surrey at CRS. Scanned entry forms may be emailed to cief.caymantreasurer@gmail.com along

with a copy of the BOB payment confirmation. Please ensure you receive an email response that your entry was received.

Age restrictions: Adult and Junior riders are allowed to ride at all heights and will be judged together.

How to pay: Payment may be made by local cheque payable to CIEF or may be made via online Butterfield Bank transfer (please attach payment confirmation to entry form). **CASH IS NOT ACCEPTED.**

Deadline: All RJC entries must be received by Midnight on the *Thursday* prior to the Event. There is no deadline for Open or Introductory Class entries, but if fewer than two entries have been received by Midnight on Thursday prior to the Event, the classes may be subject to cancelation.

Late entries: Late entries will be accepted and are subject to a late fee of \$20 per class.

Class changes / cancellations / Refunds: Class changes or refunds are not allowed after Midnight Thursday prior to the Event.

Non-competing horses / Non-competing riders: Non-competing horses and riders may only be mounted at the show grounds with the prior permission of the Show Manager. Visiting horse/riders not competing will not be allowed to be ridden at the Show Grounds.

Stabling: Visiting horses should contact the show manager to confirm their stabling needs. All visiting horses are asked wherever possible to leave stabling areas in the condition they were found.

ORDER OF GO AND WARM UP.

Registration: The registration desk will be open on the day of the show from 7:00am.

Order of Go: The order of go will be determined by a draw to take place on the Friday preceding the event and will be distributed to all coaches and posted at the showground when registration opens. First rider will be expected to enter the show ring at 8:00am.

Competition numbers: No bridle or rider numbers will be used.

Course Walk: The course walk for the RJC will take place at 7:15am. There will be a separate course walk for the open classes following the RJC.

ARENAS AND ACCESS

Warm Up Arena: The Warm Up Arena (the regular dressage arena) will open at 7:30am for coach-supervised warm up. Riders will exit the Warm Up Arena to enter the Competition Arena through the gate

at the end of the dressage arena. No more than 4 Riders in a class may be actively warming up (jumping) at a time in the Warm Up Arena. Other Riders in the class or the following class may be in the Warm Up Arena, subject to the discretion of the Warm Up Ring Steward. Those Riders not engaged in active warm up must remain in walk or trot (and not stand on the rail), be respectful, not interfere with and give right of way to those Riders engaged in their active warm up. Note that Riders should pass 'left to left' when approaching another Rider from the opposite direction. When riding in the same direction, the horse with the faster gait has the right of way on the track. Any Riders not respecting these courtesies will be asked by the Warm Up Arena Steward to wait outside the Warm Up Arena until their active warm up time commences.

Competition Arena: The Competition Arena will be closed once the course has been set up, numbered and flagged, and will be reopened for the Rider/Coach course walk. Access to the Competition Arena will be through the warm up arena. Riders will also exit through the warm up arena.

Lunging: The lower arena is available for flat warm up and lunging.

Protective Headgear: All riders **MUST** wear protective headgear at all times when mounted. **Any rider found mounted on a horse without protective headgear risks being eliminated from the show.**

GENERAL

Location of wash bays: There are two wash bays (one by the upper barn and one by the lower barn). Wash bays are available on a first come first served basis. All riders are expected to use their own grooming kits/shampoo etc.

Dogs/pets: All dogs/pets must be kept on a lead/leash.

Bicycles: No bicycles or motorbikes are allowed on the show grounds.

Concessions/bake sale stand details times: The CIEF operates a bake sale that generally offers water, Gatorade, fruit, snacks and baked goods. The bake sale is generally open from the start until the end of the show. All baked goods are donated and proceeds are used as CIEF fundraising.

Toilets: A portable toilet is located between the parking lot and visiting stabling.

Smoking: Smoking is not allowed at the show grounds.
