**CLASS SCHEDULE – NATIONAL DRESSAGE SHOW

The following classes may be ridden as part of a National Dressage Show that will take place following completion of the CEA Caribbean Dressage Challenge and Freestyle Competion:

- Any USDF Introductory B or C Test Class Fee of \$35
- Any USEF Test <u>not offered</u> in the CEA Dressage Challenge and any FEI Test <u>not offered</u> in the CEA Dressage Challenge

 Class Fee of \$50

^{*} Please note that start times are subject to change depending upon the number of entries received at each location. Start times will be confirmed on the Order of Go that will be sent out to competitors on the Friday evening prior to the show.

Age Restrictions:

For the CEA Dressage Challenge, Adults and Juniors will be judged separately in all classes and a rider is considered an adult if they are age 17 or older as of January 1st, 2019.

For the CIEF National Dressage Show, adults and juniors will be judged and awarded separately in the Introductory, Elementary, Training Level, First Level and Second Level classes only, and a rider is considered an adult if they are age fifteen (15) or older as of September 1, 2018.

Rules: The rules for the 2019 CEA Dressage Challenge are available on the CIEF website from the main menu by selecting Downloads > Rules or at http://ciefcay.com/downloads/rules-and-procedures/. All of the USEF & USDF Tests are available on the CIEF website at http://www.ciefcay.com/downloads/tests and will be ridden (except as outlined in the Notes to Competitors in this schedule) and judged under USEF rules which can be found on the USEF.org website. All of the FEI tests are available on the FEI website and will be ridden and judged under the 2019 FEI Dressage rules.

Awards/Rosettes: Rosettes will be awarded to 10th place for CEA classes and 8th place in all National classes. An adult and junior High Point Award will be presented only for the CEA Dressage Challenge classes. Awards for all classes will be presented after the completion of all classes at Equestrian Center.

SHOW ENTRY

Please note that you must be a current member of the CIEF to enter and must have a current signed liability waiver on file with the CIEF. **How to Enter – Paper Entries:** Please complete a show entry form (available on the CIEF website: www.ciefcay.com > Events > Prize Lists for Upcoming Shows) and hand deliver to Tracey Surrey at Cayman Riding School or Jessica McTaggart at The Equestrian Center along with payment confirmation or cheque.

How to Enter – Online: Fillable entry forms, *along with a Butterfield online payment confirmation* may be emailed to

Please ensure you receive an acknowledgement of receipt.

How to pay: Payment may be made by local cheque made payable to the CIEF or online via Butterfield Bank transfer (please attach payment confirmation to entry form.) **CASH IS NOT ACCEPTED**. Payment by check or proof of payment, with an online confirmation statement, must be made prior to a competitor's entry into the arena

for the class. Please note that non-payment may result in a competitor being disqualified from the class.

Deadline: All entries must be received by Midnight on the Wednesday immediately prior to the show (March 13th).

Late entries/post entries: Late entries will be accepted after Midnight on the Thursday, immediately prior to the show (March 14th) and are subject to a late fee of \$20 per class. No entries will be accepted after Midnight March 14th.

Class changes / cancellations / Refunds: Class changes or refunds are not allowed at this show.

Non-competing horses / Non-competing riders: Non-competing horses and riders may only be mounted at the show grounds with the prior permission of the Show Manager.

Stabling: Visiting horses should contact the show manager to confirm their stabling needs. All owners of visiting horses are asked, wherever possible, to leave stabling areas in the condition they were found.

ORDER OF GO AND WARM UP.

Warm up times: A detailed list of warm up times will be distributed at the same time as the Order of Go. All times and order of go must be strictly adhered to. First rider will be expected to enter the show ring at 8:00am unless otherwise specified on the Order of Go.

Draw and Order of Go: The draw will take place on Friday morning and will be distributed by that evening to all competitors and coaches, and posted at the showgrounds when registration opens.

Registration: The registration desk will be open at 7:15 am on show day.

Competition bridle numbers: Bridle numbers will be issued at registration on the day of the show. All bridle numbers MUST be returned to the Show Manager at the end of show. Any competitor not returning their bridle number(s) will be charged a \$25.00 fee.

ARENAS AND ACCESS

The main show grounds at EC are made up of two arenas, a Warm Up Arena and a Competition Arena. The EC has two additional arenas: the lower arena and the regular dressage arena which may be used by competitors at any time. The Warm Up Arena may be entered up to 30 minutes prior to one's scheduled test time. A schedule of access times to all arenas will posted along with the order of go. Competitors are asked not to enter the Warm Up Arena before their assigned time.

Warm Up Arena – to be used for coach-supervised warm up. All coaches are requested to stand at the edge/side of the warm up arena and coach in a manner not disruptive to other riders.

Competition Arena – the competition arena is to be entered and exited from the warm up arena.

Ring orientation: The Competition Arena will be available for mounted or hand walk ring orientation on the day immediately prior to the show at EC. Please contact the respective Facility Owner for orientation times.

Parking of trailers & vehicles: All vehicles including trailers, horse boxes and cars etc. should be parked outside the property in the designated parking area shown on the show ground map.

Lunging: The Lower Arena at the EC is available for lunging of horses.

Protective Headgear/Top Hat/Bowler: All riders MUST wear protective headgear at all times when mounted. Any rider found mounted on a horse without protective headgear risks being eliminated from the show.

GENERAL

Location of wash bays: At the EC there are two wash bays--one by the Upper Barn and one by the Lower Barn. All riders are expected to use their own grooming kits/shampoo etc.

Dogs/pets: All dogs/pets must be kept on a lead/leash.

Bicycles: No bicycles or motorbikes are allowed on the show grounds.

Concessions/bake sale stand details times: The CIEF operates a bake sale at the EC that generally offers coffee, water, gatorade and snacks. The bake sale will be open from approximately 7:30am to noon. All proceeds go to the CIEF to help offset the expenses of the show and for other programs.

Toilets: At the EC, a WC is located in the upper trailer/office.

Smoking: Is not allowed at the show grounds.

NOTES FOR COMPETITORS:

If your horse needs to wear an ear bonnet, it will be permitted but removed by the Steward after your ride and the horse's ears will be checked for plugs etc.

Jackets are waived for this show, you may still wear a jacket if you wish, but would then ride with a stock tie. If competing without a jacket you should leave the top button of your shirt undone (or slightly unzipped, as the case may be) and not wear a stock tie. For full details on dress and equipment please refer to the USEF and FEI rulebooks. If you have any queries please contact the ground jury or your coach before the show.

Dress and Saddlery shall follow FEI and USEF rules, as applicable to, the test being ridden.

Please note that no martingales may be worn in the competition arena. For details on approved bits in competition, please refer to the relevant governing body's rulebooks. Please ensure you are using an approved bit if you are not riding in a standard snaffle.

There is no vet inspection for this show but your horse should be well groomed and the mane braided if possible. This is not a requirement but is considered usual practice for all Dressage shows. The tail should be left un-braided. The horse may use boots/wraps only in warm up and they must be removed before entering the competition arena.
